Built to with stand the elements, the project features a black EPDM rubber roof and hard-wearing brown-coloured UPVC cladding on the doors and windows. In order to minimise aesthetic disruption to the surrounding area, trims, fascia and soffit boards are all in matching timber, with the external timber cladding left in a natural finish. Large, sliding folding doors open up the classroom to the adjacent sports fields.
